


Foreign Rulers and the Creation of an Empire

End of the Middle Kingdom: The South



- Dynasty 13 (1759-1630 BC): gradual loss of Egyptian influence in Nubia and in Syria-Palestine
- Capital relocates to Thebes
- Nile levels no longer recorded at Egyptian forts in Semna
- Southern border returns to Elephantine

End of the Middle Kingdom: The North



- Steady infiltration of Semites from the Northeast
- New settlement in east delta
- Brooklyn Museum
 papyrus shows Semites
 in Egypt

Who were the Hyksos?




- Greek form of Egyptian "Hekau-Khasut" "Rulers of Foreign Lands"
- Same name used of Beduin tribes
- Established capital at Avaris
- Became Egyptianized making Baal=Seth




Contracted burial inside a house

Ample evidence of trade with Nubia in the pottery


Avaris

- Shows a definite mixture of Palestinian,
 Egyptian, Nubian cultures with kings who have
 Semitic names.
- Ex. Yacoub-el

War Between Thebes and Avaris

- Theban princes of Dynasty 17 had continued since the end of Dynasty 13 at the end of the Middle Kingdom
- Theban Princes continue Egyptian customs
- War between the two areas lasts 30 years

Ahmose



Drives Hyksos from Avaris

Follows them to Sharuhen (Gaza?)


Re-establishes Theban rule over all of Egypt

Founder of Dynasty 18 and the New Kingdom

Early Dynasty 18 Kings

- Ahmose, 1539-1514 BC
- Amenhotep I, 1514-1493 BC
- Thutmose I, 1493-1482 BC
- Thutmose II, 1482-1479 BC (not royal, no male heir with his Queen, Hatshepsut)
- Hatshepsut , 1479-1458 BC
- Thutmose III, 1479-1426 BC


Divine Birth of Hatshepsut




Queen Ahmose led to birth room












